Hello fellow Tarringtonians,

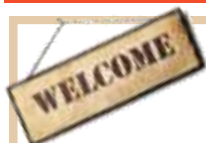

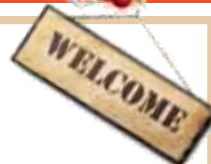

Rectors Ramblings - Inspiring Angels

What is your favourite Christmas Carol? Whatever it is, I'm guessing that amongst your favourites there will be a mention of angels somewhere. But, I'm also willing to guess not too many readers of Hop Churches News will have met a real live angel, at least not knowingly!

What is it about angels anyway? Do they always come dressed in white bed sheets and a tinsel halo? You may have other questions! In the last couple of years, I have heard a lot about Angel bombing. It seems that angel bombing is when a group of people get together to create mini angels that carry a message of hope, they are placed randomly in and around a local community and young and old are encouraged to search for and claim them. These knitted, sewn or crafted miniatures are particularly present around Christmastide and symbolise God's blessing for individuals and communities. Take a look online, it really is quite an event in some places. This new trend has got me thinking about inspiring angels.

In the bible we are told that it was the Angel Gabriel's message which gave Mary strength: "Greetings, you who are highly favoured. The Lord is with you." Though we also read that Mary struggled to believe his message at first. In the past two years you may have known the deep grief of bereavement, real worries about health or employment, or known genuine pain in everything we've been missing out on. Maybe like Mary, you struggle to believe that God loves us and promises to be with us. Yet the birth of Jesus, Emmanuel (meaning God with us) brings flesh to God's promise: I love you and I am with you.

I believe we have seen God's presence during this time of pandemic, restrictions and lockdowns. We have seen many acts of kindness and community solidarity. We have seen them on doorsteps, in the continued phone calls, notes offering help with shopping, in the simple act of a smile. Gestures offered in love which demonstrate the ongoing work of God who is love.

As we once again journey through Advent towards the celebration of Christ's birth as a vulnerable baby in a manger, may the good news of Christmas, first brought by an angel, that God loves us and is with us, help us hold on with hope. This year angels might not be bombing in knitted, sewn or crafted form in our villages, but they will be appearing all over our benefice communities in Christmas cards, in decorations, in window displays and in the small acts of kindness that often go unnoticed. As you go out and about, open your eyes and greet these angels as a message of comfort and joy ahead of Christmas. Look out for them and take heart from the spirit of hope that they represent. Maybe next year, some of you may be inspired to use your skills to become 'Angel Bombers', let me know if you would like to take up the challenge.

Tarrington's very own World Champion

In October 1960 John Gwilliam returned home victorious to Tarrington after winning the World Ploughing Championship held at Tor Mancina, Roma Italy. He had already won the British Ploughing Championship at Ross on Wye in November 1959. Amazingly John Gwilliam was the second Briton

and the second Herefordshire man to win this prestigious title following Leslie Goodwin who was World Ploughing Champion in 1958.

The family back here heard when Albert Lewis, the village school's headmaster, telephoned from Italy, and as the Gwilliam family did not have a telephone it was Horace Samuel, the chairman of the Herefordshire Ploughing Association who rushed from Ledbury to bring the news to the Gwilliam family.

The family travelled to Heathrow to meet the world champion after his flight from Italy. It was a long wait for their hero to land, clear customs and give TV and radio interviews before he was able to rejoin them. They were all treated to a meal in the West End of London that night before going to Mrs Gwilliam's sister in Ealing. That is where they stayed for a few days whilst Hereford organized a parade and civic reception although neither John Gwilliam nor his family knew anything about the arrangements. It was finally on 20th October 1960 when they made the train journey to Hereford.



When the train arrived at Hereford station John was greeted by the station master, he was mounted on a trailer with his father and his own trailer plough. The "Golden Plough" trophy was placed on a shelf at the front of the trailer. The parade left Hereford station and proceeded around the city before arriving at the Town Hall where they were met by

household cavalry trumpeters, the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress, the Town Clerk and various other dignitaries. A civic reception was held in the council chamber and his son nearly missed the refreshments served in the Mayor's Parlour as his mother had sent him out to find Miss Whiting, Mr Zimmerman's housekeeper, (at the Vine) who was holding the house key. Luckily, he found her, retrieved the key and fought his way through the crowd to his mother's side.

Although John Gwilliam and the family might have thought that was the end of it, the Tarrington Rector, John Steele, then drove them back to Tarrington in his Austin estate car, stopping at Perton where John Gwilliam and his father plus the "Golden Plough" trophy were again mounted on a trailer for a procession into Tarrington via Stoke Edith. It appeared that the whole village had turned out to greet them outside the "Foley Arms". John was carried shoulder high by John Pritchard and Dudley Williams whilst carrying the "Golden Plough" trophy aloft.



Eventually the reception moved inside the "Foley Arms" where there were speeches. It would be understandable if he was beginning to become a bit blasé about it all!

The Gwilliam family home at 124 School Road, Tarrington (now Vine Cottage) had an illuminated victory arch erected over the entrance pillars to "The Vine" and the house itself was floodlit.

Mary Gwilliam, John's wife, died at Kington in 1988, and John died at Abergavenny, Monmouthshire in 2002. Both are interred at Pembridge, Herefordshire. John and Mary Gwilliam are survived by 4 children, namely Philip born at Pembridge, Rob at Tarrington, Carol at Tarrington, and Janet at Kington.

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A Ukrainian Evening in Tarrington

The idea to have a Ukrainian evening to raise money for Tarrington Church and the Ukrainian Church in Gloucester came about after a few people met the parents of the bride and groom of the couple who married earlier this year.

The Vine had been open for the NGS the day after the wedding reception, food was left over and whilst chatting, tales of the history and culture of Ukraine emerged. It was recognised how little was known about the vast country with borders to Russia, Poland, Hungary and Belarus, it's chequered history and proud culture.



Tonya Price is Ukrainian, and attends the Ukrainian Church in Gloucester and it is from that church the link was made.

The evening itself, on November 20, was held in Lady Emily Hall and about 70 people were treated to a short film and talk highlighting the troubled history of Ukraine. This was followed by a welcome by the

priest from the Ukrainian Orthodox Church who was joined by John Watkins on behalf of Tarrington Church.



Then we were treated to a three course meal and fantastic cake, all served at tables, followed by splendid entertainment.

During the meal each table was given a performance of music played on the Lute and Violin.



There was a very generous raffle and a stall selling Ukrainian crafts. The Hall was decorated with the blue and yellow colours of the Ukrainian flag with garlands of flowers which created a lovely atmosphere.



The Women from the Ukrainian community, most of whom had cooked and served the food, transformed into singers and dancers in colourful National costumes. The songs and dances showed not only energy and talent

but what a rich culture the Ukrainians have and how those living in a foreign country as a result of political and economic strife aim to share and keep their culture alive.

It was so interesting and everyone present was humbled by how little they knew about Ukraine, but totally uplifted by the fun, hospitality and generosity of spirit shared during a Ukrainian evening in Tarrington.



It really was great fun and made some feel we should have other evenings to celebrate and learn about other cultures. We have had a Greek evening, a French night, Burns Night and now a Ukrainian evening.

Illegal Bird Trapping

Police have received a report of the trapping of wild birds in Yarkhill. A local resident discovered a number of pieces of green garden cane smeared with "bird-lime" or a similar adhesive substance in which 4 birds had become trapped. Thankfully the birds have been treated and released to a wildlife rescue centre for rehabilitation.

We are aware of a similar incident in Yarkhill around a month ago and previous reports of similar incidents in the Weobley and Bodenham areas over the last 12-18 months.

The trapping of birds, by any method, including bird lime and similar sticky traps, is illegal. We are appealing for any information in order to identify those responsible.

Chairman's Report 2020-21

Hall Activities

In the last 12 months (to September 21) we have had 5 months of complete lockdown and another 5 months with restrictions of varying degrees of severity, so Hall usage has been very limited, with little scope for fund-raising events. Happily, we started the year with reasonably large reserves and received several grants from Herefordshire Council so remain in a sound financial position.

Bookings picked up in September and this trend has continued, so we are now running at about 75% of pre-pandemic levels. Attendances remain low for functions with an older audience. We have picked up 2 bookings for wedding receptions next year, with another one possible.

The coffee mornings have been transformed into afternoon teas, due to a regular children's music group starting up on Thursday mornings, and attendances at the teas have been growing.

Flicks in the Sticks film shows re-started as soon as we could in October 2020, with restricted audience numbers and minimised social interaction – no wine, refreshments or intermission – but this stopped in January, until September, losing an important contribution to funds. The film shows are now running regularly and we plan to restart the Film Club in the New Year.

Investment in Equipment / Maintenance Activities

Early in the year, we noticed a damp problem in the toilet area, affecting several walls. On investigation, it was established that a cistern was cracked, behind a false wall and water had spread under the flooring in the Ladies toilet.

The resultant refurbishment work involved replacing the cisterns, flooring and basins in the Ladies toilet and a new false wall in the Gents toilet. This all took a long time but was eventually completed in September. Cost was just over £7,000.

During one of the lockdown periods, the chair store was emptied, the floor re-painted and walls painted. While doing this it was noted that the ceiling showed evidence of a (flat) roof leak. Quotes were obtained for

replacement of the felt roof and at the end of September we were waiting for this to be carried out at a cost of £3,600. (This has now been done.)

Committee

There have been few meetings during the last year, as we didn't adopt Zoom as a medium, relying on the large hall and distancing to maintain safety. But reduced Hall activity meant that only limited committee action was required.

Several members have stepped down before the AGM – Gwyneth Williams, Sarah Brown, Bridget Wood, John Wilesmith and Judi Ryan – all of whom have made significant contributions over the years, for which we are very grateful and extend the thanks of the Committee to them all.

Nick Brewin has been nominated to represent Dormington PC in place of Bridget. Rainey Provins and Liz Robinson have also volunteered to join the committee – Liz as Secretary – all 3 are very welcome additions to the team.

The committee does still need to be bolstered with new members, who can take on some of the responsibilities. The playing field; organisation of youth activities; social events and following-up maintenance issues are just a few examples, where a younger generation could help a lot.

Finally, I would again like to express my thanks to all the members of the committee, who have continued their efforts this year. Particular thanks are due to the officers, Judi, Jan and Graham who have devoted a great deal of time to the committee.

In 2022, Hereford Riding for the Disabled (HRDA) will celebrate thirty years of volunteer led support to local adults and children with additional needs. We are based at the Holme Lacy Therapeutic Centre, a few miles down the road from you. Have any Tarrington locals got any stories or photos to share of time spent riding or volunteering here? If you have please contact me as we are flagging local memories during this period. You never know, you might be invited back if our royal patron returns for a commemoration! Our Centre Manager, Claire, would also welcome new volunteers for 2022. You don't need previous equine experience and will be trained and supervised in the role. Rider enquiries are always welcome too.

Last July the HRDA submitted some riders to the virtual regional qualifiers at the National RDA Championships. Everyone achieved strong results, gaining rosettes and certificates. Daniel Bailey (pictured) was the main NC qualifier, achieving over the 63% threshold and enjoying great feedback from the Judge with a 67% score on an unled walk and trot. Very well done to Daniel and the fabulous HRDA pony, Lady.

Herefordshire Council (HC): Cllr Hardwick reported that HC officers and cabinet are visiting farms to reduce phosphate pollution, which is thought to be a result of 70% from agriculture and 30% from domestic sewerage.

Road Safety: Cllr Board reported on road safety issues. A list of issues was drawn up and Cllr Board will seek advice and costings from HC/BBLP and present recommendations at the January parish council meeting.

Cllr Hardwick will follow up our request to HC for Section 106 funding for the Speed Indicator Device.

Parking Barrs Orchard: Platform Housing confirmed that no decision had been made on additional parking. Members will continue to monitor.

Church Lane: Members discussed the letter received from Mr Foley, reference the proposal to improve the grass verge on Church lane used for parking. It was resolved to cease any planned improvement work and the Clerk will write to all parties to inform.

Durlow Common Road: Potholes have been repaired but the road needs resurfacing. Please can residents report all potholes via www.herefordshire.gov.uk/report-a-pothole
