Obituary for Edward (Eddie) Clive Cale

On Wednesday 8th May, many neighbours, friends and relatives met at the village Church to remember Edward (Eddie) Cale. The Church was packed, and though the names recorded numbered 135 there were many more, and it is thought that upwards of 180 attended the funeral. Eddie was born in the Parish 70 years and a couple of weeks previously, on April 13th 1954, at 'Shepherd's Cottage' Eastwood. Eddie was the youngest child born to Les and Edith. Eddie died suddenly on 15th April at his home in Little Tarrington. He had two older siblings, a brother Martin who was 8 years older, and Isabelle

known as 'Issy' who was 13 years older. Eddie always maintained that his beloved 'Issy' was more like a mother to him than a sister. Being so much older than Eddie, she was often charged with looking after him.

Eddie attended the local Village school, here in Tarrington. It was here that he first fell in love with the 'beautiful game,' and so his life-long passion for football began. He played for his school teams in Tarrington, and when he moved on to the local high school, for the Cannon Frome School Team, in the Inter-school and Sunday leagues. He continued to play football for local teams all the way through until he was 40 years of age, often being chosen as the captain of the team he played for, and regularly being voted 'man of the match'. Eddie always felt that his belief in 'working together' and his 'team ethic' was formed at this time.

Unfortunately financial constraints and commitments to family prevented Eddie from going to college to learn building which meant that he had to find a job. Eddie would very much have liked to join the Police Force, and was offered an interview. Unfortunately, in Eddie's own words 'the physical condition he suffered from, known as 'Duck's disease' (His arse was too close to the floor), prevented him from gaining entry.'

Over the years, Eddie worked at various places including the Saw Mills at Cannon Frome, and the Box Factory. But it was the recommendation for a job as a van driver with 'Ledbury Preserves' that proved to be the catalyst for the rest of his working life. They sponsored his HGV training which allowed him to go on and work for many different companies including 'Wincanton' where he became an HGV driver/trainer. Many of those he taught and mentored have spoken of what a good friend he was, and of how free he was to share any knowledge and information.

In 1982, Eddie married Sue, and together they had two sons, Matthew, and Jason, whom he loved dearly, and always supported. Matthew recalled spending time with his dad watching England play at Wembley; watching 'Spurs' play at White Hart Lane in the Champion's League; and watching the newly formed Hereford FC in their first match. Jason's memories include those of holidays and days out; of being in the cab of the truck with his dad at the Ledbury Carnival, and time spent kicking a ball around down at the Rugby Club in Ledbury and going for bike rides together. Jason also fondly remembers pushing his dad around Wembley at the FA Trophy Final.

Eddie and Jane, (nee Hoskins), began their relationship in 2014, and married in 2016. They were able to spend seven years of married life together in the idyll of Little Tarrington, where they lived in rural tranquillity with Lucy their Spaniel enjoying each other's company .

Having been so very fit, and active for so long, being diagnosed with Parkinsons disease, proved very difficult for Eddie to reconcile with. The knee surgery he also underwent severely affected his mobility, impacting hugely upon his independence. Even so, Eddie remained positive to the end. Always, he was talking about his plans, whether it was getting back to volunteering as a 'Ring and Ride' driver, planning trips to the Motor Museum, or summer trips to the sea-side.

My memories of Ed are those of someone who was in every sense a 'gentleman.' He was a gentle man and a gentleman. Though during the time that I knew him, Ed had good reason to feel fed-up with life and his lot, that was not a side of him that I ever saw. He always appeared very grateful for what he had in life, rather than being sad or resentful about what he had lost or, never had. The most important thing in Eddie Cale's life, was his personal relationships, first with his family, his dearly loved Jane, with whom, (though she may not always have believed it), Ed was besotted, his son's Mathew and Jason, and his extended family.

Ed was always ready to join in and take part in anything. Always, when Ed was involved, there would be a great deal of fun and laughter, pulling of legs and fooling around. Whilst Ed was always ready with a quick-witted jibe at someone else, and to laugh at their expense, he was NEVER hurtful, and it was quite impossible to take offense at anything he said. Likewise, Ed was more than happy to be the butt of other people's jokes and would be the first to laugh at himself.

There are many of us who have wonderful memories of the marvellous Mr Edward Cale, and we should all be very thankful for having had the privilege of knowing him.

## Another glorious walk in Tarrington

Early this morning I set off again along my favourite way, up to Aldersend. Through the farm, past the duck pond, until the track goes right towards the oak tree, in splendid isolation on the path to Durlow; this time I turned left on TR16 towards Garbrook, with the stream babbling on my left. Footpath TR17 goes right at the signpost by the first hedge, where I walked through the wheat, in the tractor furrow until I could see the footbridge in the left hand corner of the field. The birds are busy in the hedgerows and skylarks twittering

above. Across the bridge just a short walk through some more wheat to the next bridge across a stream, installed by our lengthsman in recent years. I'm glad to report that both bridges are in good order. I came out at a potato field where the footpath goes diagonally across, but for an easier walk I took the headland on the left of the field to the gate in the hedge. I arrived



at the orchard where the path continues with the hedge on the right hand side up to Eastwood on the main road, A438. From here you can cross the road, turn right towards Ledbury for a few yards and then left down the lane, over the railway bridge, and continue back to Tarrington, via little Tarrington, bearing left on the lanes. I returned back the way I came as there are glorious views across the fields and hillsides on the way back to the farm. Beautiful Tarrington changes through the seasons and at this time of year Walter de la Mare's poem, "Come - Gone" seems appropriate:

*Gone the snowdrop - comes the crocus:  
With the tulip blows the squill;  
Jonquil white as wax between them,  
And the nid-nod daffodil.*

*Peach, plum, cherry, pear and apple,  
Rain-sweet lilac on the spray;  
Come the dog-rose in the hedges -  
Gone's the sweetness of the may.*

## **Tarrington Annual Parish Council Meeting and, Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, 13th May 2024**

The Leader of Herefordshire Council, Jonathan Lester, gave a presentation on policy developments at the county level, including the recent decision to end Balfour Beatty's contract and replace it with a new support contract which gives the Council more control over activities undertaken.

Our Ward Councillor, Graham Biggs, also attended and promised to support PC / residents' efforts to implement traffic-calming measures through Little Tarrington. The options were discussed and it was agreed that priority would be given to reinstating eroded road markings and signage (by HC), followed by an investigation of additional calming measures to be funded by the PC from reserves. Introduction of a speed limit, via a Traffic Regulation Order, would be costly (Min. £10K), slow to implement, and probably not effective – especially as enforcement would be difficult due to Police resource constraints – so this route will not be pursued.

Other issues in brief:

- 1 A planning application from the Millpond Campsite, to erect a structure to house café/bistro/bar, was supported.
- 2 The Tarrington Events Committee requested a grant to purchase 2 Gazebos for use at community events and this was approved.
- 3 The footpath network will be surveyed and documented, identifying accessibility issues and other improvement opportunities.
- 4 A range of policies governing PC procedures were reviewed and approved.

John Tallis was elected as Chairman for 2024-25, with Paul Grey elected as Vice-Chairman and Chair of the Planning Sub-Committee. Other roles filled were Hall Representative, Robert Hodges; Footpaths Officer, Janette Ward; Internal Auditor, Ian Pardoe.

Regrettably, Gill Board has resigned for personal reason, so a vacancy notice will be published soon, inviting applications to serve as a Parish Councillor.

## **Rector's Ramblings**

Dear friends

Over the past few weeks, I have been surprised by how many queries I have had about the church in Tarrington. Questions like;

"I don't go to church; would I be able to be buried in the churchyard?"

"When is the church open, I would like to visit?"

"Where do I get the key from to go into church?"

"We are thinking about getting married in church, would we be allowed to if we haven't been Christened"

The church in Tarrington belongs to all those who live in the parish and it is there to serve everyone who has need of a place to worship, a space for private prayer or reflection, or an oasis of peace. It is also a place where all parishioners, whether they worship regularly, occasionally or not at all can come to mark significant life events; the baptism of a child, a family wedding, a funeral or memorial service for a loved one. This wonderful truth is one of the unsung things about the Church of England. The right to belong, enter and seek support in times of celebration or sadness in your local parish church is enshrined in English law. It is not a place for the exclusive use of Sunday worshippers, it is not a private club, it is for everyone. Did you know that if you live in the parish you are entitled to vote in the election of churchwardens, the people who represent and lead the church locally? This fact is symbolic of the nature of the relationship the church has with all those it exists to serve. It is your church.

So, if you want to go in for peace, solace, private prayer or even just a cool breather on a hot summers day, or shelter from a downpour. Your local church is always unlocked and you are welcome to enter with the assurance that it offers a space for you, whatever your creed or none.

If you have asked any of the above questions, or have another about the church or the Christian faith, I would be very happy to hear from you and help in any way I can.

## Elderflower Cordial

25 elderflower heads - no large insects!( picked on a dry day)

1 lemon +2 oranges all sliced ( don't peel them)

3lb sugar, 3 pints of cooled but previously boiled water

2oz citric acid ( from your local chemist sold in 50g packets)

Put flowers( unwashed) and sliced fruit in large bowl and pour on the sugar and citric acid powder. Add the now cooled boiled water, stir and leave covered for 48 hours. Stir the mixture occasionally during this time until the sugar dissolves.

Strain through a muslin sieve and bottle it in plastic bottles( allowing for expansion!). This should be kept in the fridge. I usually put a bottle in the freezer too.

It is ready to drink, but concentrated, so just dilute to taste for a really refreshing drink. These quantities usually make 3 litres.

(Also if you make 'ice cubes' of some concentrate they are great with fresh fruit salad!)
