Margaret Townsend more than willing to help

Many readers who have lived in the village for some time will have known Margaret Townsend who lived at 'Framfield' in Church Lane. Margaret died aged eighty-seven on 7th August and members of her family and her many friends

gathered together in the church on 5th September for a lovely service conducted by my colleague, the Rev'd. Nicky Seabright.

Margaret was born in Groombridge, Kent in 1937 the older of two girls. Her Father was a squadron leader in the RAF and living near the coast, Margaret remembered the arrival of the doodlebug bombs.

There was school in Tunbridge Wells before her first job as a PA to the head of a large firm in Cheltenham. It was a love of cricket that brought Margaret together with her husband Martin, who was the wicket keeper for the Ryeworth Cricket Club. Their first home together was in Cheltenham and later there was a move to Tupsley where Margaret became a volunteer helping with infant and antenatal clinics in St. Paul's Hall, (a time that dubbed her 'Call the Midwife' period). In the same church hall Margaret also took up the role of Brown Owl for the Tupsley Pack and rose to be a District Commissioner. Margaret was indeed an avid volunteer finding even more time to start a guide uniform shop, to help in the Cathedral Shop as well as being a member of the PTA for the Cathedral School. The move to Tarrington came via Fownhope in 1982.

Here she became actively involved with the WI as well as the Trumpet Ploughing Society. None of that, however, lessened Margaret's commitment to her family all of whom were so very important to her.

After sixty-three years of marriage, Martin died in 2022. They are both missed so very much by their daughter Karen and her two children, Lucy and Joshua as well as by, Olivia, Phoebe and Isabella, the children of their late son, Mark.

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Horse Brasses & Martingale

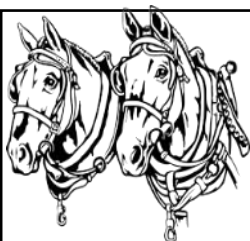
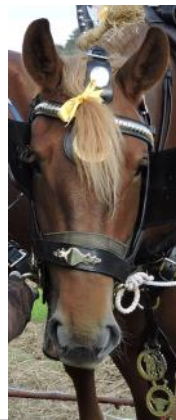


A *martingale* is part of the harness of a heavy shire horse and is made of black leather. It has been the tradition to decorate these with brassware for many hundreds of years and there was a wide range of choice of designs particularly in the 19th Century. Brass plaques were made to commemorate events, like the coronation or particular individuals as well as the extensive catalogues of popular designs. This replica

martingale is decorated with three brass plaques, each of which refers to a different location along the network of English canals and rivers. This indicates that it was for a horse that worked on the canal network.

If you go and watch the ploughing match at Sintons End Farm (see below), there are bound to be some on show.

BARCROFT EXPOSED

You may all have been wondering, on your walks up to The Common, what has happened in the corner of our garden.



One morning when Patrick was walking by The Court with Rose our dog, he heard a loud crack, almost like a gun shot. He went up to investigate only to find that a huge bough had split away from the tall willow tree up the lane. The bough had landed across the hedge line and into our garden. It was so huge it almost reached the tennis court. Upon investigation

we established that the tree was within the very edge of our boundary and after being inspected the whole tree had to be felled.

Work took place over 3 days and as the first bough was cut up and removed we realised that on falling, it had smashed down two cherry trees in our garden and all the small trees in the hedgerow.



This now leaves us with a large gap on our boundary. We will fence and plant a mixed hedge but it will take many years to give us our privacy again. I can now see why people call these trees Crack Willows. A cycle of pollarding every few years when the tree was young & growing would have prevented this from happening, 'Beware of Willows'.

Footpath TR8 in September

*“September blows soft -

A stroll along Aldersend Road brings you to a gap in the hedge on your right, opposite Croft Cottage, where Footpath TR8 meanders up the field to a kissing gate. There are blackberries and birds along the way. I could identify the birds, even though I couldn't see some of them, because on a recent walk with Herefordshire Ornithology Club, I

downloaded an App called “Merlin”. Click on “Merlin” and the app will identify birdsong! Through the kissing gate and up the hill, through the sweetcorn, you will have the best view in Tarrington village, towards Aldersend Road and beyond to the Malvern Hills; guaranteed to lift the darkest spirits. In Tarrington Common Road, “Merlin” detected robin, great spotted woodpecker, treecreeper, raven, and up on the hill on the footpath TR3 to School Road, it detected robin, dunnoek and chiffchaff.

On 14th September 2014, John Lewis-Stempel recorded, in his book “Meadowland”, “This silent void is a shock. No evening chorus, no universal hum of insects, and the lambs, now grown up, no longer bleat, they only eat, heads permanently fixed to the ground The chiffchaff has flown”.

Our chiffchaff will fly soon, to Africa, southern Europe, and a very few will winter in south-west England.

1 Forthcoming events

Apart from our regular programme of films (see Flicks in the Sticks article) the only Hall event is the AGM on November 14th. The “Swing from Paris” musical evening was a great success, which we hope to repeat in 2025. However there will be social events organised by other groups, if you can bear to miss “Strictly” on a Saturday evening !

2 Hall Usage

My comments from the last Tatler regarding availability of the Hall still stand, with scope for the Hall to host new activities during the week on a regular basis – so if you have a favourite pastime or know of a leisure activity looking for a venue - please give me a call or e-mail me. I’ve probably got contacts for fund-raising, if that is an issue.

3 Playground Equipment Replacement ?

We had another active Saturday morning taking down the fence between the play area and the main field. Some work remains to be undertaken – mainly filling-in post holes and levelling some areas.

We have had a couple of suggestions for new equipment, but we would still welcome your views about having a playground area with a comprehensive equipment set. Your participation in a group developing and managing this facility would be even more useful.

4 Grant Applications / New Equipment

In September, we submitted an application to the National Lottery “Awards for All” fund for money to cover most of the cost of 3 items:

- a) Replacement of Flat roof above the entrance Hall
- b) Replacement of Windows/Doors at the car park end of Hall
- c) Refurbishment/Rebuild of boundary wall along entrance drive

The decision will take up to 12 weeks, so no activity until the New Year.

The committee has decided to buy our own mower and we will be cutting the playing field grass, rather than sub-contracting this task.

4 Volunteers to Join Committee ? (YOUR HALL NEEDS YOU !)

A number of people have offered to assist the committee, and we will be in discussions with them to match roles with people. Hopefully we should be able to fill all the positions when we hold the AGM.

There’s still scope for more help though – happy to speak to anybody who wants to support the Hall.

All are invited to the AGM – even if you don’t want to take an active role on the Committee !

Tarrington Parish Council Meeting, 9th September 2024

1 Ward Councillor, Graham Biggs, reported that the government expects Herefordshire to increase house building by 80%, from 773 per year over the next 20 years, to 1,375 per year. Herefordshire Council (HC) is working on a Local Plan due to be published next year.

The road resurfacing programme is progressing as part of an £8 million budget for 2024/25. The works on Mordiford Bridge had progressed well, as had the bridge repairs at Bartestree.

(Post meeting note: Re-surfacing work on the A438 is scheduled for October through Eastwood and Pixley)

2 Residents at the meeting identified difficulties caused by overgrown hedges making footways/ footpaths unusable and forcing pedestrians to walk on the carriageway. Cllrs Grey and Tallis will survey (including discussions with relevant householders) and report to next meeting.

3 Following a meeting with the HC Locality Steward, the Clerk will complete and submit the Community Commissioning Application, covering a range of “traffic-calming” measures, on behalf of PC. This will include a detailed costing of the project, to be funded by the PC.

4 Lady Emily Hall refurbishment; Cllr Tallis set out plans for repairs to the boundary wall, flat roof replacement, windows and door replacement. Total cost £22,387. Lottery grant of £19,972 has been applied for. Parish council resolved to support the project and consider request for grant funding, following receipt of the decision on the Lottery Grant application.

5 Cllrs Grey and Ward will represent the PC at the Herefordshire Parish Council Summit on the 8th October 2024. This gives the opportunity to explore the services offered by HC departments and learn about HC’s plans – and feedback any reservations we have !

Cllrs Tallis and Ward will attend the Hereford Association of Local Councils (HALC) AGM on 26th October 2024. HALC provide training and advice to PCs.

6 Footpaths Officer had carried out a survey and presented a list of repairs (tarringtonpc.org.uk - see Council Business - PC minutes). The Clerk will pass these to the Ward Councillor, to liaise with HC Public Rights of Way Team.
